Battisti.

Most recently, Maj. Robinson served as the U.S. Army Central Command Band Liaison Officer, coordinating theater level music support for U.S. Army Central Command. Prior to his arrival at the Army School of Music, he served as Commander and Conductor of The Army Ground Forces Band where his band was a strategic communications asset for the U.S. Army Forces Command. Previously, he served as Associate Bandmaster of The U.S. Army Band “Pershing’s Own” where he was Director of The U.S. Army Herald Trumpets and The U.S. Army Band Downrange.

Maj. Robinson has led ensembles at such events as the 55th Presidential Inauguration, the state funerals of Presidents Ronald Reagan and Gerald Ford, the White House arrival ceremony for Queen Elizabeth II, the dedication of the National WWII Memorial, “Christmas in Washington,” the Kennedy Center Honors, “A Capitol 4th” as well as performances with the National Symphony Orchestra, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra and Akron Symphony Orchestra.

His other assignments include Executive Officer and Associate Conductor of The U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command Band and as Executive Officer of Student Company, U.S. Army School of Music.
